Next Steps

1. Complete your application.

Applications are considered on the basis of the work completed and posted on your official transcript at the time of application. You must maintain a satisfactory GPA in all transferable college work to remain qualified.

2. Send your transcripts.

Request that official sealed transcripts from **all** colleges or universities you have attended be mailed directly to the Office of Admissions at the campus to which you are applying. You'll find addresses on the back cover of the admission application form. You must report **all** colleges or universities you have attended.

Failure to disclose and submit complete and accurate information may result in the denial of admission or subsequent dismissal from WSU.

3. Meet departmental admissions requirement.

Once you are admitted to the University, you may need to meet additional requirements to be admitted to selected majors. Consult the online catalog (www.catalog.wsu.edu) for specific departmental and program requirements. Some departments' application deadlines are earlier than the University's priority deadlines listed on the cover. Please contact your academic department for more information.

4. See how your credits transfer.

Become familiar with the University's Transfer Course Equivalency Web site, located at www.wsu.edu/advise/transfer-courses.

If you have completed a Direct Transfer Associate (DTA) degree from a Washington community college, which includes courses that approximate the WSU General Education Requirements (GERs), you will be considered to have fulfilled the lower-division GERs and will generally be given junior standing. Some other states also have approved associate degree programs with WSU. If you have completed an approved associate degree from one of these states, you will be considered to have fulfilled the lower-division GERs but are not guaranteed junior standing. Washington State Residency for Tuition-Paying Purposes

- As a student, you are a resident if (1) you are financially dependent* on your parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and (2) one parent or legal guardian maintains what is known in legal terms as a "bona fide domicile" in the state of Washington for the 12 months prior to the beginning of the semester for which you applied.
- You are also a resident if (1) you are financially independent* of your parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and (2) you maintain a bona fide domicile in the state of Washington that is separate and distinct from an educational purpose for the previous 12 months. Washington state law provides that it is your burden as a student to prove that you are a resident for tuition-paying purposes.

*If you are financially independent, you cannot be claimed as a dependent for tax purposes and you must be primarily financially self-supporting for the current and prior calendar years.

Residency provision for non-citizens or non-permanent residents of the United States who reside in the state of Washington

Washington state law makes certain students who are not permanent residents or citizens of the United States eligible for resident student status—and therefore eligible to pay resident tuition rates. To qualify, you must have met the following requirements:

- Resided in Washington state for three years immediately prior to receiving a high school diploma and completed your full senior year at a Washington high school, or
- Completed the equivalent of a high school diploma and resided in Washington state for the three years immediately before receiving the equivalent of the diploma, and
- Resided continuously in the state since earning your high school diploma or its equivalent

You must also certify your intent to take steps to become a permanent resident as soon as you are eligible to apply. To obtain additional information and the certification form, visit www.tuitionres.wsu.edu.
